## Auburn's History Column: **Part 1 of 2**

In 2016, it was a shock to the Auburn community in the year of the Jubilee 150 of the Institute, to have it closed for safety

reasons by the owners of the building, the Clare and Gilbert Valleys Council. Plans for celebrating the occasion from when the Town Hall was built in 1866 could not be fulfilled. A local committee met with Council in an effort to see what could be done to restore the Institute complex to again be a working facility for the town. Following this the Auburn Institute was handed back to the community by the Council with a financial grant and the extensive renovations that were necessary took place.

The Auburn Community Development Committee is proud of the stunning renovation and is inviting community members to the "Grand Re Opening Cocktail Party" of the Auburn Institute on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2018 at 5.00pm until 7.00pm.

Community gatherings started in Auburn as a church service in a blacksmith shop in 1850, from then on during the 1850's the loft in the Rising Sun Hotel stables was used for public occasions such as meetings, bazaars and dances, besides being used as the "courtroom". It was also reported that some early "Anglican" church services were held in this "courtroom". The stable loft had the instruments for the telegraph installed by Charles Todd in 1862 before the Post Office building was completed.

In 1865 the Auburn Town Hall Company was floated, built by a limited liability company with a capital of 800 shares at £2.10/- each. The foundation stone was laid by chairman of Directors, Mr. A. King, on January 1<sup>st</sup>, 1866. Mr W. T. Bleechmore was the secretary and Mr McGeorge the architect. The building was constructed by stonemasons Messrs J. Meller and J. Scott and carpenter W. Threadgold at a cost of £1,788.10/-. W. Dunlop did the plaster moulding inside by hand with few tools. The block of land on which it was constructed cost £63. The company was not a success and after 6 or 7 years the building fell into the hands of Mr F. Treloar.

The committee bought from the mortgager, Mr Frank Treloar, the then insolvent Town Hall, for £1,000. As a fund raiser, the committee built the rooms (now flats) east of the hall towards the river, which were sold to Arthur King, auctioneer, then to J.E. Bleechmore. The hall, by 1890, was free of debt, owing to the constant work of the then, untiring secretary, Mr Jamie Ford, manager of the National Bank.

At first kerosene lamps provided lighting, then acetylene gas produced by the Institute, illuminated the building in 1871. Additional rooms were completed in 1884. These rooms face King Street, the foundation stone being laid by Mrs Harvey and built by J. Meller and R. Smith, Mr Naish being the architect.

In the 1870's the Floricultural and Horticultural Society started holding annual shows. The containers for such shows were only discarded in 2016.

In the 1880's the roof line of the hall was altered. The early curved iron of the western section of the roof was revealed this year when the new roof was installed as part of the renovations.

In August 1881 a new proscenium and stage accessories were placed in the Auburn Institute Hall through the generosity of the Oddfellows and Foresters Lodge. This was celebrated with musical and dramatic entertainment.

Another entertainment was roller skating. The Auburn Institute set up a skating rink in 1889. Of the many promotional flyers about forthcoming entertainment at the Institute in the 1800's, whether concerts, theatrical entertainment or skating, such words as the "moon will be in full dress at 9.00pm" encouraged patrons to support the functions at night. Some functions were in aid of the "Institute Building Fund" or "In aid of the Institute".

### **The Riesling Railway – Book Launch**

A publication on the history of the railway line from Riverton to Clare will be released by the author, John Wilson, at the Auburn Railway Station ("Horrocks Wines") on Wednesday 4th July 2018 at approximately 9.15am.

The book in colour is for sale at \$95 on this occasion and after 7th July, for \$110 at the National Railway Museum at Port Adelaide. John will be visiting the Watervale General Store, Penwortham rail car stop and then at the Sevenhill platform, planning to arrive at

the Clare railway station (station sign) at about 11.15, to distribute books.

There will then be the celebrations of 100 years of rail to Clare, with an unveiling and the visit of invited guests, school children and the general public.

100 years ago, the Auburn School children were given a free ride on the train to Clare for the opening of the line celebrations. The line was opened to Auburn by January 1916.

## LAMBERT Elaine January 1930- May 2018



A lifetime of community service of former Auburn identity, Elaine Claire Lambert, was recalled recently by funeral celebrant Richard Berry, at the Auburn Uniting Church. A large gathering of people from a wide area of the State came to honour her memory on how she had touched their lives. She supported George her husband, who pre-deceased her, when he was chair of the District Council of Saddleworth and Auburn, their dairy stud with annual showing of stock at the Royal Adelaide Show, and the involvement of other fellow skiers that George assisted with his speed boat when staying at their Barmera shack.

She assisted in many community organisations which included her major contribution with Uniting Church activities, as a Councillor for the District Council of Saddleworth and Auburn, as well as some metropolitan based organisations, but her most notable contribution was to the Country Women's Association. Elaine was a Life Member of CWA, joined in 1952, from 1968-1975 was Branch President, 1976-1977 Group President, 1977-1980 Divisional President, 1980-1983 State President. As a CWA representative, Elaine travelled overseas to Canada and Vancouver where she spoke at an International Conference.

Elaine had lived the last 16 years with her daughter Julie Anne McBride and son in law Neville, at Barmera.
