ACDC December Report

Christmas Eve in Centenary Park: No, the Christmas Eve in the Park event is not on due to COVID-19 restrictions and implications.

Unfortunately, ACDC and Auburn Traders Association have decided to cancel the planned Christmas Eve in the Park. This decision was not made lightly. It was made after considering a range of COVID-19 related factors. (e.g., numerous entry/exit points to the Park, a limited number of persons allowed to attend, turning away people once over that limit, extra volunteers to assist with marshalling, health and financial risks).

New Sub-Committee U2Kids: The new sub-committee of ACDC, **U2Kids**, (yes, that's the name of the new 'youth group' recently formed) approached ACDC with the idea of an alternative experience. So, there will be a **"Santa's Cave"** held in the Auburn Institute. This will operate from **6pm to 8pm on Christmas Eve in the Auburn Institute**. Families will have their own time with Santa, and this will be monitored to allow for all families to have this opportunity. COVID-19 safe practices will be in place. Exit will then be from the King St. doorway.

Auburn's History Column:

Bremner and Growden new owners of the Auburn Foundry

Bremner and Growden records show they were in business from 1871 to 1882. They actually purchased the Adamson Bros business June 5th 1876. In December 1871 they advertised as follows:

MESSRS. BREMNER & GROWDEN beg to announce that they have Commenced Business at Auburn, as BLACKSMITHS, WHEELWRIGHTS, and General IMPLEMENT MAKERS. Buggies, Spring-carts, Wagons, and Drays made to order and repaired.

James Greig Bremner, who came from Scotland as a young man, married Eliza Mary Growden, daughter of George Growden of Cornwall, England. Bremner's partner, William Growden, son of George Growden, married Louisa Perkins, sixth surviving daughter of G. H. Perkins, whose farm "Primrose Farm", consisted of several section numbers in the vicinity of Horrocks Highway and Kelly Road, Undalya. James Bremner and William Growden both involved themselves in community affairs.

One such occasion was a cricket match between "AUBURN UNITED TRADESMEN" AND "BREMNER AND GROWDEN'S EMPLOYEES", details of the match report as follows: -

There was not time to play the second innings. A return match will be played.

In country shows the following were the types of agricultural implements competing for awards in the 1872-1877 years that Auburn businesses were involved in:-

Wagons, tip dray, spring cart, plough, double furrow plough, triple plough, buggy, reaping machine, winnowing machine, scarifier, set dray harness, seed sowing machine.

In September 1882 the partnership of Bremner and Growden was dissolved by mutual consent, Mr Bremner carrying on the business. "Already men are being engaged, and ere long



the furnaces will be in full swing". Mr Growden moved to a farm at Laura to manage a Perkins property there, the property of his father-in-law George Henry Perkins.

Grain Stacks -

Scenes from the Auburn Railway Station yards depicting the grain stacks from the 1968-1969 grain harvest have been donated to the Auburn National Trust by Bill Hean. This was the last season grain was stored at Auburn before bulk handling took over in the region. The handling of grain in bags is a sharp contrast to the current harvest where bulk handling is used.

For the grain stacks, dunnage (that is timbers laid as a foundation to keep grain dry off the ground), hessian curtaining (once the stack is completed the walls of the stack are protected from the weather) and roofing (of galvanised iron sheets on a timber frame) to enclose the grain stacks from the elements of the weather. To remove the grain to market or a sea port, elevators were used to load the bags of grain from the stack to a rail truck where a grain lumper would position the bags in the rail truck.

The builders of the Auburn stack for the 1968/69 season were lumpers Gus Clark and Brian Byrne. Brian recalls lumping the grain into the rail trucks when the time came to rail the grain out. He also recalled Ted (E.H.P.) Whitehead was present. According to a delivery claim docket held by Don Lambert signed on 10/02/1969, the Licensed receiver for the Australian Wheat Board for the season 1968-1969 was Mr Whitehead.
