ACDC March Report

Southern Gateway Project: Very exciting news was received by the Southern Gateway Project sub-committee at the end of February that their grant application with the **Foundation for Regional and Rural Renewal - Tackling Tough Times Together (FRRR TTTT)** had been successful. This means that the long-awaited project now has sufficient funds to be progressed. Thanks to Graham Richards and his team for persisting with seeking funds so that the largest sculptural statement from the initial concept drawings can be installed. Our thanks to **Councillor Elizabeth Calvert** who wrote the grant application and also thanks to other members of the sub-committee, **Glen Baum, Trevor Mace, Jim Laurie, Greg Anderson, Cherry Stowman and Anne Bastian.** We look forward to further updates as work progresses.

Reminders about meetings to be held next week at our Auburn Institute.

The “Fantastical Bicycle Spectacular Event”: Planned for October 2022 will have a second meeting on Monday 15th March at 5 pm in the Supper Room, Auburn Institute. Background to Marjanac Design.


My name is Rado Marjanac.




Auburn's History Column:

Auburn School Boy's story

(Dean Roberts continued)

In March 1945 I was unfortunate to contract "Scarlet Fever" and was quarantined for six weeks. Was very ill at the beginning. Only had contact with Mum and the Doctor. *(Dean still has the document of instructions Auburn Doctor, Doctor Finey, gave)*. Not good for a very active 10/11-year-old. Can still taste that revolting medication and waving from the window to the kids coming home from school.



Doctor Finey's instructions – Dean Roberts –

Tablets March 9th, 1945

Tablets to be given crushed up into a powder and mixed with some water or milk.

Tablets to be given regularly by the clock.

While taking the tablets give no salts i.e.

Epsom's, Glaubin's, Kruschen's etc.

½ hour before giving tablets give ½ teaspoon of Carb soda in ½ cup of water or soda water.

Dose of tablets Every 4 hours

1st dose 2 tablets

2nd dose 1 tablet


Then 1 tablet every 4 hours

Suggested times 10pm. 2am. 6am. 10am.

Finishing Primary School, it was decided that I would go to College. Sacred Heart College at

Somerton was the final choice. 1st Year I was a border and this was a great period. It was a new and different world. 2nd and 3rd Year, I was a day boy and this presented a whole new scenario.

It seemed that I had inherited the "Robert's gene" for running. Excelled in all the sprint events along with all the jumps. Won many trophies and held records and competed in Junior State events.



Dean at Sacred Heart College

In Intermediate our English play was The Merchant of Venice and an English Company was performing at the Majestic Theatre. Off we go to see a performance and I was immediately hooked. Theatre life was for me. 1950: - Finished School. Took a Christmas job at Charles Birks and stayed 14 months. Then took a position as a junior Trainee at Myer.

During all this time I was involved in Theatre. Joined W.E.A. acting school and performed several plays with several different Amateur companies. Saw every professional show that came to town and through all this I got to know many of the performers. Ice shows were all the rage at this time and of course this became

what I wanted to do. Through contacts I was offered to join the chorus when the company returned from their New Zealand tour. How, I couldn't skate, no ice rink in Adelaide. Off to Melbourne, got a job at the Gas & Fuel Corporation, took lessons at The St. Moritz ice rink and skated every night for six months.

True to their word I had the job in the chorus. Snag I had to be in Sydney on a specific date. Packed my bags and Greyhounded it to Sydney.

The show was Rose Marie on Ice. We toured all the states and this was followed by a series of other shows including pantomimes. Eventually a new show, Spice and Ice, opened at the Tivoli Theatre in Melbourne and Sydney. This was followed by New Zealand. Due for South Africa but Apartheid put a stop to that. Hence the end of show and I returned to Adelaide.

Somewhere in all this I had to fit in National Service. 3 months at Woodside in the middle of winter. Nevertheless, I loved it and ended up a Corporal.

Whilst resting up between shows I was approached by Myer to do some modelling and photographic work. Local Boy makes good etc. Was very successful and was asked to stay on.

Part of National Service was that one had to do 2 years C.M.F. and as this had been deferred a few times I now had to fulfil that obligation. 27th Battalion. Full Scottish Kilt and all the accoutrements.


