The Open Meeting will:

<u>Defibrillator Training:</u> ACDC organised a 'training session for use of a Defibrillator. This was held on 10th July, with 18 attendees. I take this opportunity to thanks those who attended. There are three defibrillators within our community which are available to the public 24/7. These are currently located on the verandah of the **Auburn RSL Building**, verandah of **the Rising Sun Hotel** and in the Camp Kitchen at the **Auburn Caravan Park**.

<u>Future Training:</u> ACDC is researching possible training sessions for First Aid and Responsible Service of Alcohol for community

members to attend. As we gather information, it will be shared if community workshops are possible.

<u>The Music Wall in Centenary Park:</u> This has been replaced under warranty, due to the malfunction of some of the metal attachments holding the 'music' bars in place.

<u>Terms of Reference:</u> ACDC has begun a review of the Terms of Reference for each of its sub-committees. This is to ensure that all sub-committees align with the principles of the ACDC Constitution, and to review the election and replacement process for sub-committee positions.

Auburn Frenchfest: The Auburn Frenchfest is drawing near and the pace of organisation is picking up. Auburn's History Column:

Auburn Library building 2023

The building known as the Auburn Library with its external library book receival facility, was closed by the District Council of Clare and Valleys when COVID Gilbert health restrictions became necessary. It was never re-opened. The library had been conducted under the supervision of the Librarian from the Saddleworth Library, with a team of Auburn locals as rostered volunteers for opening hours, reporting in to the Librarian per telephone to Saddleworth on arrival and departure from duties.

The volunteer duty officer recorded the number of callers, including tourists looking around. Per the computer system for South Australian libraries, all returns and new borrowings were entered. Stocked was a wide range of publications and magazines for all tastes, with changeover books regularly carried out by Council Library staff. Children of all ages were catered for in a delightful area with quality publications.

The library building is an Heritage listed building in a Heritage Streetscape and was formerly the council office for the District Council of Upper Wakefield. Many years ago, David Young, when on the Early Buildings committee of the National Trust of South Australia and a staff member of the Department of Mines and Energy, visited Auburn on a Saturday morning and with Keith Thomas, Peter Taylor, Josephine McDermid and Kay Lambert, visited the local quarries. He matched up our buildings to the quarries. He already had knowledge of Auburn bluestone (Meller's quarry), the Manoora quarry and Mintaro slate quarry

His description of the construction materials of the Auburn library is Meller stone quoins and calcrete (limestone). Limestone gathered from the surface of paddocks, having weathered for years, does not fret. The plinth level marks the floor level and stones below this level he said are probably field stones, gathered in a wagon. (Note the building description materials in the ramp construction photo). He identified the marble foundation stone as from Carrara in Italy, where Michelangelo sourced his marble.

David Young went on to be a Consultant in Canberra.

This work will be carried out in the next few weeks, whilst we have the opportunity and the roses are dormant. Depending on who purchases the Auburn RSL building, perhaps some of the roses can even be returned to their current location in the future.


