## LITERARY AWARDS...

Continuing the C.J. Dennis Centenary celebrations, incorporating the children's essay awards

The winery veranda, garden seats with colourful umbrellas and shady trees were welcome shade on the warm day, visitors and writers listening to some of the poetry reading by Keith Conlon and Max Fatchen of "The Advertiser". The Winery staff cooked chops, hamburgers and sausages on four gas barbecues. Terry Stephens cut up nine sheep that were donated for the celebrations and made 27 kgs. of Hamburger mince and 50 kgs. of sausages which is approximately 1,000 sausages. The hamburgers and sausages were his own recipe, which received complimentary comments.

18 ladies prepared the salad foods and grapes during the morning, Mrs Joan Sandow being the convenor. Free wine from a special C.J. Dennis label bottling, cordial and iced water was available all the afternoon. Later a large quantity of watermelons, grapes and mixed fruits were served, added to \$50 worth of mixed fruit the SA Writers Fellowship brought up from the market in Adelaide.



This Historical Souvenir was available to purchase at the centenary celebrations at the winery – was from the unveiling of the Drinking Fountain memorial in 1953.

Commemorative functions were held throughout the year.

The Children's Essay Competition Awards as part of the Centenary Celebrations of the birth of C. J. Dennis, were presented on Sunday September 22nd 1976 at a Devonshire Tea. Nick Crawley was M.C. for the programme which consisted of C.J. Dennis poems presented by some school children, also Letty Allen and Tony Clark.

Competition judges were Madeline Brunato, President of the Writers Fellowship and Nan McLeod, Secretary of the Fellowship.


At the entrance to the Institute, drawings suitable for the occasion were arranged by Brian Sandercock, Paul Henbest, Kym McDermid and Geoff Turnbull.

The Chairman of the C.J. Dennis Centenary Celebrations, George Lambert, then introduced Margaret Neudegg, the winner of the award- winning plays which were to be presented by the Q Theatre in Auburn on October 10 and 11. Also introduced was Loriel Smart, producer of the "Sentimental Bloke" production in the Q Theatre in Adelaide and who was to produce the prize-winning plays in Auburn in October as well as act in them.

Special mention for the success of the competition went to Mrs Jean Moyle who visited the schools and to Mrs Jean Glover who was in charge of the prize-winning day. Madeleine Brunato presented the awards

## ACDC Australia Day Event Feedback and Survey – May/June 2023

#### Summary of feedback received from an Auburn resident after the 2023 event:

- Reduced numbers attending;
- Not enough advertising;
- A raffle wasn't held/tickets sold prior to remind people of the event; and
- Limited available seating/tables to sit and eat breakfast.

#### Suggestions put to ACDC for consideration to plan future events.

- Review of advertising strategies.
- Re-instate raffle for Australia Day.
- Allocate some Xmas Eve in the Park raffle prizes for an Australia Day raffle.
- Sell raffle tickets before the day.
- Set out additional tables and chairs reserved for older members of the community.
- Organise community volunteers to transport people with reduced mobility.

## The above feedback about the Australia Day event was discussed at the ACDC April Open meeting and the following points were raised:

- Ways to improve advertising. e.g., article/editorial in the Plains Producer (read by Council Australia Day Committee), flyers at PO, IGA, large sign in Centenary Park.
- Provide additional seating we would need to borrow /hire outdoor chairs and tables for less mobile adults.
- Discuss how donations for the Xmas Eve in the Park raffle are gathered with Auburn Business and Tourism Association (Auburn B&TA). Christmas Eve in the Park is jointly organised with Auburn B&TA organising the raffle and entertainment and ACDC the BBQ and Santa's Cave (U2Kids).
- Council has three Official Events for Australia Day held in Clare, Riverton and Saddleworth. Councillors are allocated to attend these events, so not always able to attend the Auburn event.
- Focus for Auburn Australia Day event is on Community Awards and a community gathering with entertainment. It may be preferable to choose a different date for a community breakfast and Auburn residents would then be free to attend one of the Council official events.
- Predicting numbers for the Australia Day breakfast can be difficult which impacts on organisation of the catering. Suggestion to use *an on-line* booking system to indicate attendance.
- Australia Day event follows soon after Christmas Eve in the Park, so need to consider volunteer availability/burn-out.
- Suggestion made to have separate committees to organise each event.
- Provide transportation for less mobile members of the community (this may raise insurance issues).
