ACDC – May Report

Autumn in Auburn is really a great time of year: dewy mornings, sunny days, a sprinkle of fog, and just one frost, and the sound of new born lambs! We have our first bottle fed lamb, and saved twins today!

Southern Gateway Project: ACDC acknowledges the contribution of the subcommittee members over the past six years and thanks the members for their commitment to this Project. This \$100,000 project has been an important one for the township of Auburn. We are delighted that the generous bequest by the late Alan Farwell to establish a Southern Gateway to Auburn is now a reality. The ACDC committee approved the winding up of the Southern Gateway sub-committee at its May meeting. ACDC will now investigate through Council the requirements for ongoing and continued site maintenance.

<u>U2Kids</u>: ACDC wishes to thank the Clare & Gilbert Valleys Council on behalf of U2Kids, for the Community Asset grant it received in late 2022, for the purchase and installation of a metal pod (cubbyhouse type structure) and music wall. These items have already delighted children and adults while visiting our park. U2Kids committee organised its first movie night at the Auburn Institute in the last school holidays, and hopes to have the event again each school holidays. There will be a different 'theme/genre' for each movie night, to appeal to a range of youth ages, and families.

<u>Auburn's Australia Day Event:</u> ACDC's Open Meeting in April held discussions on the Australia Day Breakfast. Information was gathered from those present and feedback at the time of the event. All information has been collated for your reference and is included in this Auburn Express along with a Survey (refer pages 10 and 11). We would very much appreciate you taking a moment to complete and return the survey, his will assist with the future planning of this community event.

<u>Advertising Poster Opportunity:</u> Calling all community groups! Don't forget the opportunity to advertise your group and associated activities in the 'Auburn Welcome Pack' given to new residents through the Post Office. <u>Community Garden Groups:</u> ACDC accepted the *Terms of Reference* prepared for Auburn Garden Groups' sub-committee to provide an "umbrella" for these volunteers to work under, with communication channels to Council and inclusion in ACDC's insurance framework.

ACDC Strategic Plan: ACDC members have spent considerable time over the last month, brainstorming and workshopping, to produce the first draft of a Strategic Plan for ACDC, this Plan will be used to guide activities over the next five years. **Memorial Place:** A report on the Memorial Place was presented at the ACDC April Open Meeting, but was overlooked in my April report. Apologies to the Memorial Place subcommittee. Please see a summary of points below.

The redevelopment of the corner of Centenary Park adjacent to the public toilets and WW1 Memorial has been the subject of discussion between ACDC members (past and present), community members, the Auburn RSL and Council for around 9 years (since 2014) since Council removed a stand of old, dangerous and untidy, predominately pine trees from the site. More recently, the area has been included on the "Auburn Streetscape Plan" for redevelopment.

A sub-committee of ACDC was formed at the start of 2023 to prepare plans, consult with Council and fundraise for the project. The current plan will see the redevelopment of the corner to make it a more attractive space in the heart of the town; provide "off road" space for commemoration activities to be conducted; and bring the WW1 and WW2 Memorials and the flag pole into the same precinct allowing wreath laying on both Memorials during any commemoration service


The WW2 Memorial gates are to be refurbished by Cooks of Balaklava with polishing and refurbishment of the engravings.

The current sub-committee has taken on the task of raising the required funds for this project, through sponsorship and fundraising activities.

Auburn's History Column:

LITERARY AWARDS

The Auburn annual Literary Awards, which give children an opportunity to research and express their poetry writing skills on a given subject, are usually open for entries at this time of year (through until August). Briony Ackland, Principal of the Auburn School, has offered to coordinate the awards for this occasion. The awards will be announced during the *Frenchfest* in Auburn in September.

The literary awards commenced with adult participation from throughout Australia, commencing with the celebration of the centenary of the birth of C.J. Dennis, born in the Auburn District hotel number one bedroom, 7th September 1876 (This hotel has since been demolished).

How did a literary competition get established here at Auburn?

Madeleine Brunato, President of the South Australian branch of the Australian Writers Fellowship, approached Norm Burfield, District Clerk of the District Council of Saddleworth and Auburn, with the plan of the Fellowship sponsoring an Australian-wide competition to celebrate the centenary of C. J. Dennis's birth and intimated they would like to tie in with any celebrations proposed by the Auburn District. A meeting was held in March 1973 at Auburn, when a committee formed and initial planning commenced.

The year of celebrations started off at Chateau Clare (now called Taylors Wines) in March 1976, the large crowd welcomed by George Lambert, Chairman of the District Council of Saddleworth and Auburn. Br. May of St. Aloysius Church, Sevenhill, officially opened the occasion, saying he felt he had a special bond with Dennis in the fact that 100 years ago a fellow Jesuit, Father Strele, rode on horseback from Sevenhill to Auburn to baptise new-born Dennis.

Br. May said the writers paid Dennis a wonderful tribute by electing to come to Auburn as the culmination of Writers Week. He also said that it is fitting that the profits for the year of celebrations in Auburn go towards the construction of a Senior Citizens' Home to be built on the site of his birth.

Some of the Adelaide and inter-state visitors travelled in two buses, one planning to leave after the afternoon program and the other after the filming of the black and white film of Dennis's most famous works, "The Sentimental Bloke", in the evening.

Present was the Federal President of the Fellowship of Australian Writers, Patsy Adam Smith from Victoria – she was also the Chairman of the C.J. Dennis Vic. Committee which was holding their celebrations in August and September. Interstate writers visiting Auburn came from as far away as W.A., Vic., N.S.W., and Queensland. The publishers, Angus and Robertson, who hold most of the copyright of C.J. Dennis works, were represented, and were amazed at the demand for the books from the book stall.

The C.J. Dennis Literary Competition winners announced that day were in the categories

Section A- Plays, Section B - Lyric Verse, Section C – Narrative Verse. First, second and third prizes were awarded, with commended entries. Nancy Keesing of Sydney, Chairman of the Literature Board of Australia Council, announced and presented the awards.

Interstate people were well represented in the awards. This Literary Competition was organised by the Writers fellowship who were assisted by the Literature Board of the Australia Council.

The winning play was produced by the 'Q' Theatre in Auburn later in the year.



ACDC Australia Day Event Feedback and Survey – May 2023

Summary of feedback received from an Auburn resident after the 2023 event:

- Reduced numbers attending;
- Not enough advertising;
- A raffle wasn't held/tickets sold prior to remind people of the event; and
- Limited available seating/tables to sit and eat breakfast.

Suggestions put to ACDC for consideration to plan future events.

- Review of advertising strategies.
- Re-instate raffle for Australia Day.
- Allocate some Xmas Eve in the Park raffle prizes for an Australia Day raffle.
- Sell raffle tickets before the day.
- Set out additional tables and chairs reserved for older members of the community.
- Organise community volunteers to transport people with reduced mobility.

The above feedback about the Australia Day event was discussed at the ACDC April Open meeting and the following points were raised:

- Ways to improve advertising. e.g., article/editorial in the Plains Producer (read by Council Australia Day Committee), flyers at PO, IGA, large sign in Centenary Park.
- Provide additional seating we would need to borrow /hire outdoor chairs and tables for less mobile adults.
- Discuss how donations for the Xmas Eve in the Park raffle are gathered with Auburn Business and Tourism Association (Auburn B&TA). Christmas Eve in the Park is jointly organised with Auburn B&TA organising the raffle and entertainment and ACDC the BBQ and Santa's Cave (U2Kids).
- Council has three Official Events for Australia Day held in Clare, Riverton and Saddleworth. Councillors are allocated to attend these events, so not always able to attend the Auburn event.
- Focus for Auburn Australia Day event is on Community Awards and a community gathering with entertainment. It may be preferable to choose a different date for a community breakfast and Auburn residents would then be free to attend one of the Council official events.
- Predicting numbers for the Australia Day breakfast can be difficult which impacts on organisation of the catering. Suggestion to use *an on-line* booking system to indicate attendance.
- Australia Day event follows soon after Christmas Eve in the Park, so need to consider volunteer availability/burn-out.
- Suggestion made to have separate committees to organise each event.
- Provide transportation for less mobile members of the community (this may raise insurance issues).
