With the sale of the RSL Clubrooms, a wealth of information is to be found in the minute books over the years from 1919. There was a district returned servicemen sub-branch in operation from minutes in July 1919 held at the Saddleworth showground and over some following years rotating from Marrabel, Riverton, Saddleworth and Auburn then not so much Marrabel.

From the fragile pages it appears the first Chairman of that sub-branch was G. W. Parker, who in the following years represented the Watervale Ward on the District Council of Upper Wakefield before becoming the chairman of the District Council for a few years. The Auburn Sub-branch Minute book commences on Saturday March 20th 1920 with Mr Parker being elected to chair the meeting, when a resolution was passed to elect officers and form a committee.

Mr W. Fitzgerald was elected to be chairman of the sub-branch. He was greeted with acclamation on taking the chair. Vice Presidents were Messrs. Sobels, Parker and Dennison, with Secretary, Treasurer being Mr Barnes. There were so many nominations for the committee that a ballot was held – Messrs. Pollard, Walker, East and Pearse were duly elected committee. (According to the minute book R. Dennison received the Military Medal – MM – during World War I)

A representative to go on the Local Repatriation Committee and District Committee to be elected later. The meeting decided that all prospective members be a committee to meet and hear Mr Guthrie on the following Monday night 23d March in the Auburn Institute. Mr Guthrie was the official organiser of Sub-branches and provided all the particulars on how to operate.

The **Official Charter for the branch was issued on 23rd March 1920**, to the Secretary with a quantity of stationery, payment for the latter due to a stationer.

The meeting moved that a letter be written to the local repatriation committee asking permission for a member of the sub-branch to sit on their executive. Mr Parker was the nominee.

Mr Dennison was elected as the sub-branch representative on the district committee.

To enable the branch to become solvent the meeting decided to hold a social dance to obtain some funds, deciding to request the ladies of the Red Cross and Comforts Funds to assist.



Memorial Place Update February, 2024



Work well underway:

The site works including the retaining wall, steps and infill, with associated electrical and plumbing connections, was completed prior to Christmas 2023. The next stage of the **Memorial Place** siteworks is the installation of the footings for the relocated WW2 Memorial Gates. The engineering for the footings has now been approved.



Cook Memorial commenced the further dismantling of the WW2 Memorial Gates this week. The pink granite stonework is to be refurbished and the information on the pillars is to be restored so it can be more easily read. This is the first restoration work on the gates since they were first erected after WW2.



Fundraising for the completion of the project is continuing.
