Peter was acting Principal of Auburn Primary School for 17 years during which time he also coordinated the CJ Dennis and *Max Fatchen Poetry Awards*...these Awards were commenced for local students but soon enquiry and entries to the Awards were received from multiple schools across South Australia.

Both Peter and Wendy have been and still are, dedicated to their volunteering endeavours with Scouts, Wendy also was a Brownie and continued through to Girl Guides where she became a Ranger and Leader...Peter has held significant and leading roles in his Scouting involvement since 1989. He is also one of the Group's Emeritus trainers, a title he will hold for life. Wendy also holds an important role with Scouts, now acting as District Commissioner Karkana District since 2021. They have both been awarded and honoured with the Silver Kangaroo, the highest award for Scouting in Australia.


Their involvement and roles and contribution with the RSL are immeasurable – Peter was RSL President from 2008 to 2020 and Wendy also involved in roles of treasurer and fundraiser.

We also acknowledge Peter as acting Principal Lay Preacher of the Midlands Uniting Church.



Auburn's History Column:



Beckers 70 years

Walter Richard Becker, known as Ric, established his business in Auburn on 25th January 1955 in a small shop which was the middle one of three being constructed in a building owned and built by Sylvester P. Stephens, known as Scally and son Harley. Prior to opening Ric visited all the houses in the town to introduce himself and tell people about the shop and asked for their support.

A year or two later Ric moved to the southern-most shop the Henry Street end as later the central one was Stephens' shop front for the building supplies and building contracting business. This had a door into the large shed at the back where woodworking machines, being a combination machine, saw and plane thicknesser, also mortising accessories, were set up. Caravans were built and truck trays – when timber truck trays were being built the noisy buzzer could be heard in the area. The truck cabins and tray timber sides were shadow sign written and comprised artistic decoration.

Ric moved to the southern shop near Henry Street, where he operated the first 'self-serve' in the district that the customer selected their items in a basket. At the counter the groceries were listed on a docket by hand. The shop on the north side of the complex was completed last and was for many years a Hambours haberdashery store, one of the country stores whose headquarters was Eudunda. Their large sales, drew big crowds.

When this photo was taken business in Auburn was very different to that of today. Some people had a cow but on the south side of the now Uniting church, a Road House was conducted by the Nayda family, where customers took their billy to get milk ladled into it. Fuel was pumped into your vehicle by the Nayda family, and you got your Newspapers there. On the north side of the Institute was Bill and Dorothy Matz's Bakers shop. Bill baked the bread, made a variety of yeast buns and extremely popular pasties. For green groceries, Mrs Glovers shop (now Velvet and Willow) stocked these on display shelves in boxes and had a large array of glass jars with confectionary displayed. School children with their pocket money after school would file into her shop for their little paper bag of lollies.

The Auburn businesses in those days relied on the rail per goods train overnight on Wednesdays when Ric would go first thing on Thursday morning for the goods that had been dropped off in the station goods shed. The Riverton/Spalding line was closed after fire damage on Ash Wednesday and the rail transport ended in 1983.

Becker's IGA currently uses the whole building, encompassing the original Stephens workshop. By walking along the veranda, the doorways of the original three shops are obvious. Nowadays Beckers carry a lot of the items previously stocked and supplied by a number of different businesses in the town.



Ric learnt his grocery trade by working at Eudunda Farmers at Saddleworth starting earning seven shillings and sixpence per week. He was later transferred to Eudunda Farmers at Gladstone in 1941.

In 1942 Australia's situation became very grave, the Japanese rapidly advancing towards Australia, invasion being feared. All males between 18 and 40 were directed to report to the nearest Post Office in a few days, Gladstone was Ric's nearest. Ric then received his instructions the following week to go by train to Adelaide, which was the beginning of Ric's army training and war service.

After the war Ric returned to Eudunda Farmers at Saddleworth for about 8 years and then decided to start his own general store in Auburn.

The grocer would call on you on Mondays for your order and later deliver it.

Business hours in those days were 9.00am to 5.30pm during the week, opening Saturday morning but closed on Saturday afternoons and Sundays. There was time for sport but owing to war injuries Ric was limited to goal umpiring for football but concentrated on golf. He played lawn tennis for a couple of years then cricket. He played day and night bowls, giving up bowls at 90. He also was on a lot of town committees, his meticulous bookwork shown in minutes or financial records.

Richard started in the shop in early 1979 after he left school. He too, played sport for the community and was involved in the CFS. By 1984 the shop was much bigger with increased display of items.

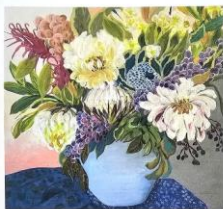

Memorial Place Update – February, 2025

Memorial Place - Nearing Completion

Over the past 2 months there has been substantial progress toward the completion of the Memorial Place project which commenced in March 2023.

During November, the Clare & Gilbert Valleys Council workers completed work on the King Street entrance to Centenary Park. They poured a concrete strip where the WWII gates had been located; relocated the 2 bollards; levelled the entrance area with loam; and repaired the paving.



The remaining work since November has been completed over a number of 'Working Bees', using Memorial Place subcommittee members and a number of other willing community volunteers. These working bees were organised during some extremely hot weather and there were a number of early starts. So-far, these volunteers have put in more than 120 hours of voluntary work on the site.



The work completed has included:

- Installing posts and rails at the King Street entrance to Centenary Park to define the new entrance and create an additional area of garden;
- The acquittal of 2 grants toward the project. One from the Waterloo Wind Farm and a second, a Community Asset Grant from Council;
- The assembly of the 5 planter tubs and their installation in Memorial Place;

- The filling and planting out of the planter tubs with rosemary;
- The installation of 4 aluminium bench seats, and
- The planting of photinias behind the memorial gates to eventually create a green backdrop for the WWII gates.



We did need to come to the rescue of the *photinias*, after the first burst of extremely hot weather following their planting, nearly cooked them. They are currently protected by a shade house; this will be removed once they are better established and when the extreme weather has finished.

What is left to do?

Hopefully, in the next few days, the in-ground lights will be installed in front of the WWII gates, so that they will be illuminated at night. The netting on the fence rail at the King Street entrance to the park is also scheduled to be completed soon, weather permitting.

The Clare and Auburn RSL are also organising the construction and installation of 2 flag poles on site.

So, the Memorial Place Project as it was first planned is almost complete. The subcommittee will then turn their attention to some form of permanent on-site recognition of donors for the project and the possibility of some small shade structures over some of the seating.

The *Auburn Institute Management Committee* (AIMC) has spent some time over the past few months reconsidering the hire costs of the Hall and the associated spaces and equipment.

There is a **Standard Hire** rate for both a full day hire and now a half-day hire (less than 4 hours), which applies to non-Auburn hirers.

The AIMC has reviewed the **Auburn Community hire costs**. Auburn residents have always been eligible for a discount on the hire of the Auburn Institute. We are now offering a huge **50% reduction on the standard hire rate until June 2026**, for Auburn residents and community groups, in an effort to reinvigorate the use of the Institute.



This reduction is also a reward and to acknowledge and thank the many Auburn community members who volunteer their time to assist with Auburn Institute fundraising events.

Many residents would also be aware that the Institute is equipped with state-of-the-art screen and projector on the stage for presentations, slide shows and movies. It also has a fabulous lighting system for photographic and art exhibitions.

So, let's get behind the Auburn Institute.

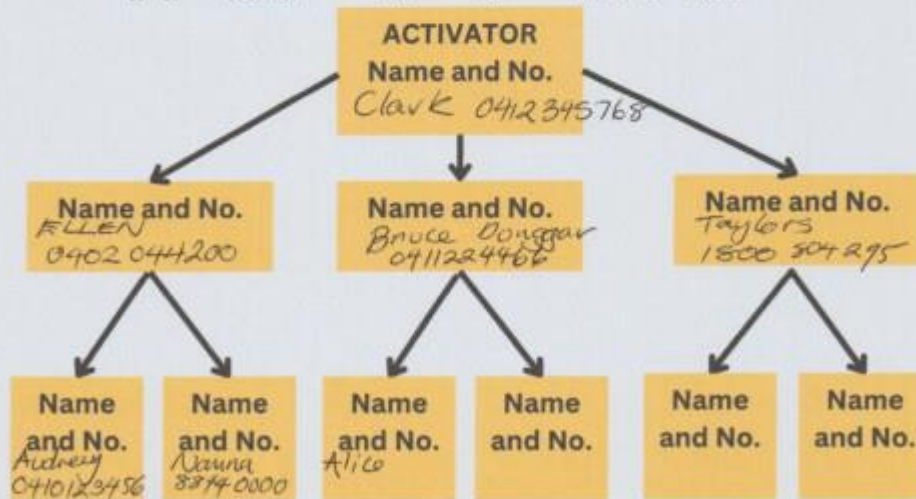
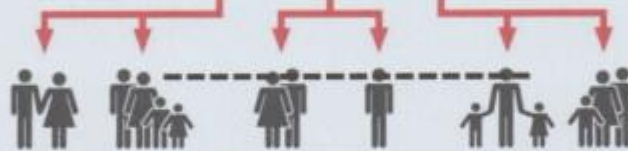
