



Auburn's History Column:

<u>Premier Declares Auburn Receation Park</u> Open

Opening of the Park on 23rd April 1960 continued...

Sir Thomas Plyford, in opening the park, said he was very pleased to have the opportunity to declare the Park open. It was obvious to him of the great effort that had been made, and it would be an effort that would stand for all time. The people of the district were helping the young people by providing the facilities. He was also delighted to see the Marching Girls.



There were nine Marching Girls teams, this shows four of the teams from Port Pirie

In a special tribute to the S.A. Police, he said that he considered the S.A. Police Force second to none in the Commonwealth, and wished to thank them publicly for their loyalty.



The Police band provided the music for the day

Amid great smiles from assembled Auburn School children, he granted them a holiday for Tuesday April 26.

The Premier then declared the Recreation Park open and unveiled a Plaque which read:

Auburn Recreation Park opened by The Honourable Sir Thomas Playford G.C.M.G., M.P.

ANZAC SERVICE:

An Anzac Service was then held, the Police Band playing 'Last Post' and 'Reville', while Mr. George Lambert recited the "Ode".

GRAND PRADE:

All Floats and marching girls headed by the Police Greys and Band moved round the Oval in a Grand Parade.

A feature of the Grand Parade were the cattle. and those studs parading the cattle were: Jerseys – J.H. and D.P. English, 'Ulster' Stud; B.A. and J.M. Kench, 'Kenfield'; M.C. Garrard, 'Garford'; S.A. driver, 'Bencobin'. Friesians -G. P. Garrard, 'Pinebray' **Guernseys -** F. D. 'Wandelo': G.& Mintern. E. 'Kercoonda' A.I.S.- G.W. and J.G. Williams. 'Greenwood Park'. **Poll Shorthorn -** R. E. and J. 'Vendale', M.E. Nicholls,

(none of these studs operate today)

'Grahamville'

There was also a display of Stud sheep while side shows, hot dog and other stalls did a roaring trade.

'Abercrombie' Poll Herefords - F. Kellv.

£30 (\$60) was taken at the gate, while gross takings were approx. £650 (\$1300), which included the Grand Ball on Friday night.

During the afternoon the Marching Girls and Police gave marching demonstrations, and the police

riding, jumping and Tent pegging from on horseback while the band music continued.


