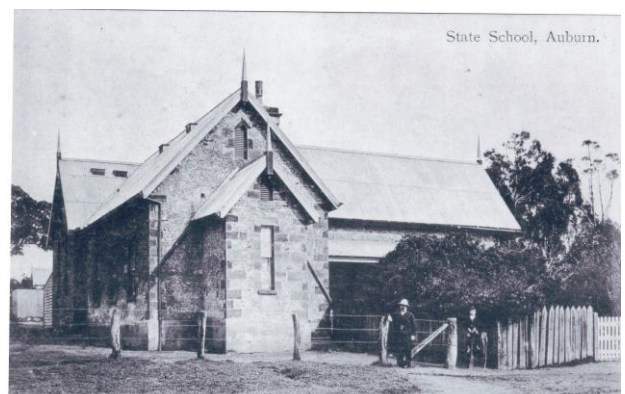

Auburn's History Column:

Education in Auburn

Over the years a number of volunteers have helped to collate the memorabilia related to the local school, which has been helpful to those tracing their family history. Those inquiring for information usually bring information which we have been able to add to Auburn resources. The local National Trust branch would welcome any further memorabilia the Auburn Express readers may have.



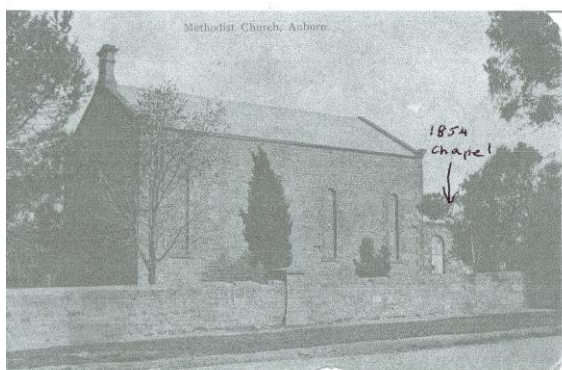

One of the valuable resources is the data base prepared by Janet Kench, a Registered

Volunteer of the Auburn branch of the National Trust of South Australia. Janet spent many hours preparing duplicate copies of the Auburn Public School Admission Registers and Teachers Registers, so that a copy could be available in the Auburn Museum. These can be researched by appointment. Now that all the former school registers have been handed to the State Library by the Education Department, Janet through the local branch, made available a USB of the data base to the State Library. These records were copied with the signed approval of the *Principal* of the school of the time.

As other school memorabilia is donated it needs collating in albums and people and occasions identified. This has been done recently by volunteers. Some early photographs still have some unnamed students in them.

The public-school history commenced by the pioneers in Auburn in 1855 using the first Bible Christian Chapel, which was built in 1854. There were 17 boys and 11 girls enrolled, Mr J.S. Cole granted a licence (No.16). Mr Cole combined school teaching with his duties as Council Clerk. Mr Cole transferred to Watervale later. We have details of teaching staff up until 1966, but unfortunately details of this nature were no longer published by the Education Gazette but were computerised, and not so readily available.

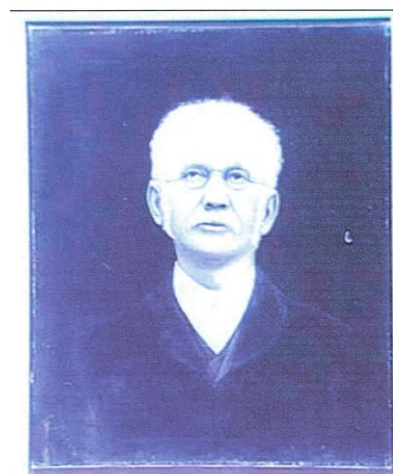


The early Chapel used as the first Public School premises was behind the current Uniting Church building. The house next door was the manse for the church minister. (The old chapel was then used for a Sunday School until demolished). (This photo loaned by the late John Greenslade of Riverton from his Post Card collection).

Fund raising for a public school led to the foundation-stone of the new Auburn School being laid by Mrs Braddock in March 1859. On Monday January 2nd 1860, the cost of the "new and commodious school" was opened at Auburn on the Upper Wakefield, cost being £750 of which more than £100 still had to be raised. Dr Braddock was the Secretary/Treasurer.

Trustees for the school were Wm. Spicer, J.E. Bleechmore, G.D. Young, Wm. Hocking, Wm. Threadgold, John Dickerson, John Braddock; John Braddock being Secretary.

A new master had to be found for the school; this was Mr Thomas Caterer. Jean Yule in the Braddock history described Mr Caterer's background. "At the age of thirteen Mr Caterer was sent to an endowed grammar school near London. As Mr Caterer himself remarks, he found much there to avoid in his future career as a teacher. He was subsequently articled to a good private school on the banks of the Thames, and after gaining the necessary experience became assistant master in a large boarding school near Windsor Castle. ...He then became private tutor in the family of a gentleman in Northamptonshire, this being the first instance in which he was to carry out those ideas which resulted so successfully in future years."

The Chairman of the District Council, G. Young, explained the position of public schools, and invited the new master, to give his views on education. Mr Caterer read a

paper on the relative duties of parents, teachers and pupils, and the physical, intellectual, and moral results that should be aimed at a system, of education.

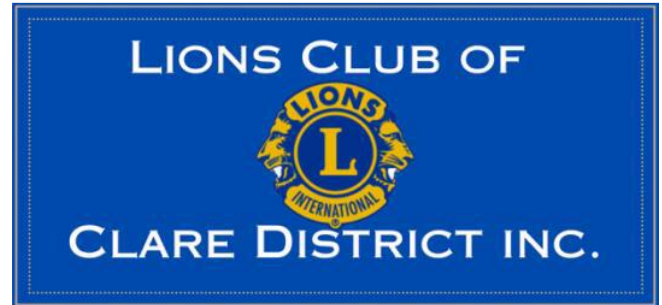

While it's tempting to keep these “just in case,” or to throw them in the bin or sink, doing so can create risks for our families and our environment. Thankfully, Australians have a **free and easy way to dispose of unwanted medicines safely: *The RUM Project (Return Unwanted Medicines)***. ([Return Unwanted Medicines](#))

The RUM Project is a **national initiative funded by the Australian Government** through the Department of Health to help communities return unused and expired medicines for **safe disposal at no cost**. Medicines can be taken to **any participating community pharmacy across Australia**, where pharmacists will place them into secure RUM bins for environmentally responsible destruction. 3 Easy Steps to Recycle Your Medicines

1. Read – Look through your home medicine areas, check expiry dates and identify medicines you no longer need. ([Return Unwanted Medicines](#))
2. Remove – Take those unwanted medicines out of cupboards and store them in a bag or container ready to bring in. ([Return Unwanted Medicines](#))
3. Return – Take them to your local community pharmacy and hand them to the pharmacist for placement in the RUM bin. ([Return Unwanted Medicines](#))

Why This Matters

For People – Storing unwanted medicines at home can be dangerous, especially for children or older people. Accidental ingestion, misuse or confusion about what to take can lead to serious health problems. Proper disposal keeps homes safer and removes the risk of people accidentally taking the wrong medicines. ([Return Unwanted Medicines](#))

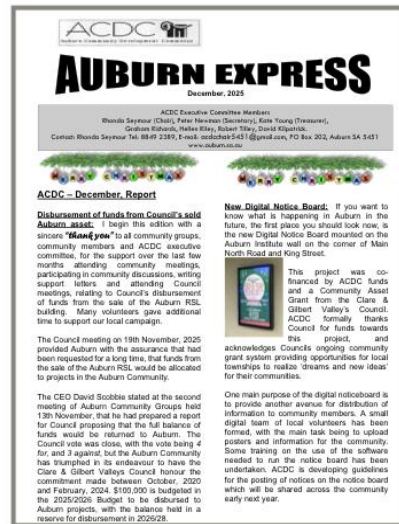

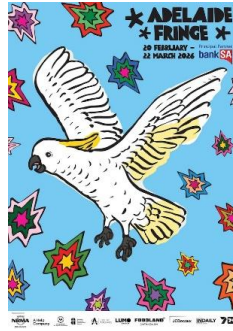
