Now back to home jobs...

Memorial Place: ACDC extends thanks to the Memorial Place subcommittee for their dedication and attention in helping to create a wonderful community space, having completed the original brief for this project, this subcommittee is now *wound up*. The small surplus of funds will be held by ACDC for future maintenance or any improvements that may be of benefit in this space.

ACDC Membership: ACDC has accepted two new members to our Association. Welcome Judyta and Julie, and we look forward to working with you on our community projects. Remember, if you are not a Member of our Association please consider joining...there are no costs!

Funds from Sale of RSL Building: At Council's meeting in May, the Elected Councillors supported all four applications that were submitted to the Auburn Community Grant Program by ACDC, accessing funds from the sale of the RSL building in Auburn.

Approximately \$144,000 was accepted for these projects - waste water and toilet, stonework restoration, and furniture and air conditioning for the **old Council Chambers** on St. Vincent Street, and funds for **U2KIDS** proposed Bike Track project at the Auburn Recreation Park.

Congratulations to the teams of volunteers who contributed many hours preparing the necessary documents for these detailed submissions. The next step is to sign the Funding Agreements with Council which we hope will take place soon. I take this opportunity to thank the Elected Councillors for giving their support for these Auburn community projects

Frenchfest: Due to the depleted number of volunteers taking on subcommittee roles, the *Frenchfest* working group has been officially wound up. ACDC will have future discussions on what other possible events or celebrations could be planned in this community. It has been widely agreed that the Auburn community (people, volunteers and businesses) benefited in many ways from the previous *Frenchfest* events. It is hoped that some form of future event will become a reality.

Consumer & Business Services: ACDC recently took up an offer from Consumer & Business Services for a review of its Constitution and Terms of Reference (ToR). ACDC received some positive feedback on its current documents, with only a few minor details being noted as requiring revision.

Digital Notice Board (DNB): The DNB has been established as an additional means of sharing community information, along-side the *Auburn Express* and social media. The DNB has been operating for just six months. ACDC is hopeful that more groups and businesses will plan to access this community asset.

There are costs involved in the DNB's ongoing operation - and this shaped the original proposal of a small fee for advertising. In an effort to attract more users to this advertising option, **ACDC is withholding 'fees' from now until 31st December 2026.** If you or your group would like to submit advertisements, please make contact with the digital team at acdcdigital5451@gmail.com to discuss your requirements, our volunteer subcommittee cannot formulate your advertisement for you.

Landmark, Significant Change to Future ACDC Meetings: From July 2026 (next meeting), ACDC will be opening its monthly meetings to interested community members, to attend as observers. ACDC is keen for community members to learn more about what our executive committee does. The meetings are usually held on the second Monday of each month, at 7pm, at the Auburn Institute supper room, King Street entrance. As the July meeting will be the first opportunity **open to observers**, we will introduce a few simple protocols to ensure the meetings are productive. It is hoped we can introduce opportunities for community members to put forward questions and/or information ahead of meetings. More explanation will be provided along the way, as we navigate this new concept with our community members.

Auburn's History Column:

Education – a St. Josephs Convent called St. Brigids...continued

J.E. Bleechmore was addressing the fundraising bazaar in 1882 *continued*

“The facilities for education, then, being so abundant it is almost a sin for parents to neglect to send their children to school, for if they cannot afford it they can have it free. Your church offers it to you, and the State offers it to all. But there is a great difference between the State schools and the one of St. Brigid’s. In the first place the Government build the school, provides the furniture and appliances, and pay the teacher, and if any children attending whose parents cannot afford to pay, they go free. This school of St. Brigid’s receives no external aid whatever, and therefore depends for its success for your sympathy and support, and I trust by your liberality you will show your appreciation of the

work in which these ladies are engaged, and enable the promoters to accomplish their good intentions. I now declare the bazaar formally open.”

There were two stalls for goods reaching almost three quarters the length of the hall for the assortment of useful, ornamental and other articles tastefully displayed on tables and one for refreshments. Around the hall were hung a good display of engravings, quilts, children’s clothing, antimacassars (*covering for the back and arms of chair for protection or ornament*) and other articles. The platform? (*we call stage*) decorated with pine and bamboo and trimmed with pink and lace. On the platform were some crewel-worked ottomans, a chair, the work of the Sisters and valued at £25, a very large well-dressed doll and a fire screen.

The names of the stall helpers were Carrig, Moylan, Kennett, Baum, Holland, Madigan, Worner, O’Donoghue, Burns, Crawford, Mahar, Plew and Curren.

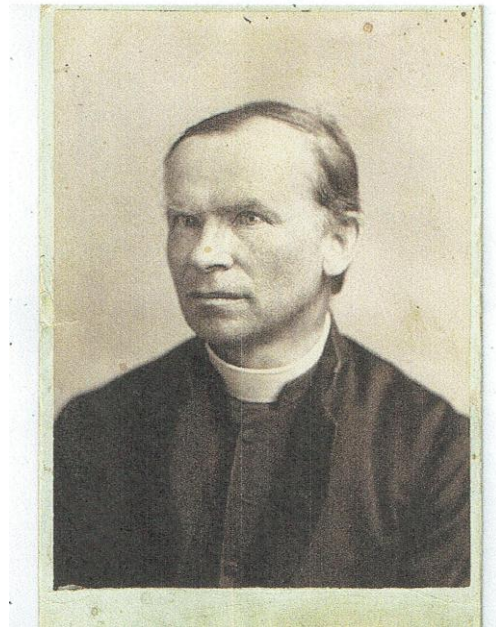
We don’t have any admissions registers of the children attending the convent, but from Janet Kench’s data base work with Auburn school records, we note that children from these families, some big families, moved onto the Auburn Public school from the Roman Catholic School (their parent’s occupation listed): Chomel (Farmer), Collins (Carter), Cornish (Labourer), Dean (Green grocer), Dodge (overseer), Herley (labourer), Holmes (labourer), Blackburn, (labourer), Boss (labourer), Fitzpatrick (Farmer), Williams (labourer), Brown (from Hoyleton convent) and Clason (from Rhynie convent).

The Township Directory 1885 listed the Roman Catholic place of worship being at St. Josephs with Rev. T. O’Brien as visiting. In Tony Griffin’s book “St. Anthony of Padua, Manoora”. Rev O’Brien was the first native born South Australian priest and a Manoora parishioner. He was ordained in 1883. His photo in Griffin’s book. The Catholic church at Undalya was part of the Manoora Parish.

2026 Clare Valley flocking of the woollen sheep

The 2026 Clare Valley Festival of the Lamb in partnership with the SACWA Warnes Group and the Plains Producer is staging a Clare Valley knitted flock of woollen lambs and window display.

The Clare Valley Festival of the Lamb is a multi-day festival which began in 2020 with a focus on attracting people to the Valley to celebrate the sheep industry. It is the regions spring equinox festival which combines with the first buds of the vines and the premier time for new-season lambs.

The SACWA Warnes Group are collaborating with the festival and the Plains Producer for the Flocking of the Sheep Exhibition. This is designed for people to create a sheep using wool and then send it to the festival so they can then be displayed throughout the Clare Valley at selected venues. At the end of the festival the sheep will then be rounded up and made available for the SACWA Baby Parcels and Emergency Aid.

Clare Valley Family Pharmacy is now offering the 2026 influenza vaccine to help protect the local community against this year's flu season. The vaccine available is the **2026 flu vaccine**, as recommended for use in Australia this year.

The influenza vaccine is recommended annually for everyone aged six months and over. Vaccination helps reduce the risk of serious illness, hospitalisation, and complications caused by the flu, especially in higher-risk groups.

Under the **National Immunisation Program (NIP)**, the flu vaccine is **free** for eligible individuals, including:

- People aged 65 years and over
- Pregnant women
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people
- Individuals with certain chronic medical conditions

At Clare Valley Family Pharmacy, flu vaccines are available to those aged **18 years and over**, with a private fee of **\$25** for individuals who are not covered under the NIP.

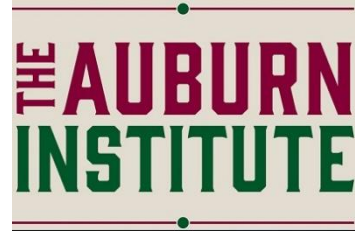

SOLD...

St. John's Church, St. Vincent Street, Auburn...Circa. 1862



After some time, St. John's Church on St. Vincent Street sold in April after dwindling attendance numbers forced the Church's closure in 2024.

We understand the new owners, from Adelaide will move in to revive the old Auburn church.

The ashes of 16 people interred in St. John's grave site will be dug up and moved and stored with Pearse Memorials in Clare. Arrangements are being made with the Clare & Gilbert Valleys Council for 8 sets of ashes which will be going to the Auburn Cemetery (one set of ashes will be placed into Memorial Wall in Auburn Cemetery).

The remaining sets of ashes will be going to St. Marks, Penwortham, St. Michael's, Bungaree, North of Clare and Saddleworth Town Cemetery

Ashes to be relocated:

Norman Milton Burfield, Frederick Richards, Gerald James Moore, Thomas Lawes Moore, William Poole Long, Norman William Parker, Cora Vera Read, Dorothy Patricia English, Leslie James Unwin, Neta Pauline Unwin, David Cargo, Melva Cargo, Brian Edmund Withers, Peggy Hawker, Hector Hawker, Colin Arthur Pfitzner.

A small group attended a special prayer service for the "removal of ashes" held on Tuesday 9th June at St. John's Church officiated by The Rt. Rev'd Jeremy James, tssf, Bishop of Willochra, assisted by Rev'd Anne Ford - "This has all been done very sensitively and very reverently" ...Rev Ford said.

The Willochra diocese will cover all costs associated with the removal and reinterment of the ashes.

NOTE: The Anglican Diocese of Willochra are planning, in agreement with the new owners (of the church) to have something outside the property saying where the ashes that were in the ground are now (in case a relative ever returns).

NATIONAL RECYCLING WEEK

PLANET ARK

Established by Planet Ark in 1996, **National Recycling Week** is held every year during the second week of November. Its aim is to raise awareness about the importance of recycling, as well as reducing, reusing and repurposing, so as to keep valuable materials out of landfill and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

And its working! Since 1996, the recycling rate in Australia has gone from 7% and just 1.5 million total tonnes recycled to over 60% and 43 million tonnes of materials recycled. That's from 80kg per person to about 1,700kg.



November 26 is **World Sustainable Transport Day**.

Sustainable transport — with its objectives of universal access, enhanced safety, reduced environmental and climate impact, improved resilience, and greater efficiency — is central to sustainable development.

Whether it's for work or for pleasure, the choices we make on how we get from one place to another — driving, flying, ferrying, biking, scooting, and public transportation — can have a large impact on carbon emissions. Making informed lifestyle choices when it comes to transport can help to reduce carbon emissions and improve air quality.

Community Watch: Staying Safe in Auburn This Winter

Winter in the Lower Mid North brings cozy nights, but it also introduces significant hazards. By following official advice from the **SA Country Fire Service (CFS)** and the **State Emergency Service (SES)**, our **Auburn** community can ensure a safer season for everyone.

Road Safety: Slow Down for the Conditions.

Winter rain makes our regional roads exceptionally slippery. According to [South Australian Road Safety](#), drivers should always "drive to the conditions," which means reducing speed when the road is wet. This is particularly vital on the stretches between **Auburn** and neighboring towns where "black ice" or oil film can make braking unpredictable.

Storm Safety: Falling Branches

Our iconic gum trees pose a real risk during winter winds. The [SA SES](#) notes that strong winds often lead to falling branches and downed trees. Residents in **Auburn** are encouraged to "look up and live"—regularly check trees on your property for dead wood and avoid parking vehicles under large canopies during high-wind warnings.

Home Safety: The Danger of Bar Radiators

Heating is a major cause of winter house fires. The [SA CFS Home Fire Safety guide](#) highlights that **bar radiators** are especially hazardous if misused. They must be kept a minimum of two metres away from any flammable materials like curtains or bedding. The CFS also stresses the **"two-metre rule" for children: never let kids play near heaters and always supervise them in heated rooms.**

Smoke Alarms: Your First Line of Defence

The [CFS website](#) reminds us that a working smoke alarm is the only way to be alerted to a fire while you sleep. Check your batteries monthly and ensure the unit is less than 10 years old.

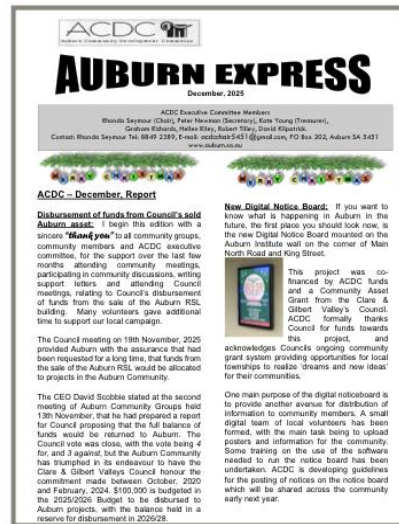

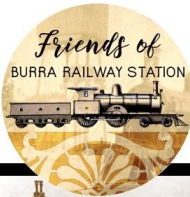

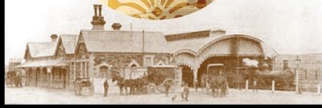
