ACDC – July, Report

ACDC welcomed **5 observers** to its meeting on 13th July. These attendees shared information from the Auburn community. Thank you for taking up the opportunity to broaden our connection with the Auburn community.

During June, ACDC representatives met with:

- Councils Acting CEO, Richard Dodson to ask questions and share community information;
- The Digital Team working on Auburn's website redevelopment and management of the digital noticeboard;
- **U2KIDS** representatives for discussions on the Bike Track Project
- And provided the venue for a recent community consultation on C&GVC's 2026-27 Budget and Business Plan, led by the Acting CEO, Richard Dodson.

Signing of Grant Agreements: ACDC representatives met in June for the signing of the Auburn Community Grant Program Agreements. We await acknowledgment from Council for its representatives' signature, and then we will be forging ahead with the necessary actions.

Damaged Brench seat: ACDC is aware of the broken bench seat on the River Walk at the eastern end of Centenary Park. We wish to thank Council for removing the tree branch which fell on the seat. ACDC is exploring possible options to replace the bench seat.

Please note that the remaining structure has been wrapped with bunting to prevent usage.

The remaining structure will be removed in the near future by our volunteers. This seat was installed in 2010 as part of an ACDC community project with 4 others being placed around the township: front of Beckers IGA, Dennis Road lookout, Centenary Park and Memorial Park.

ACDC Constitution: ACDC executive committee members are undertaking a full review of its Constitution, following recent information provided by a representative of the Consumer and Business Services. Committee members will continue to review the document over the coming weeks, intending to share a final draft with all members in August. This will allow for input from members ahead of a final document ready for presentation at ACDC's AGM in October.

August Open Meeting: the August meeting for ACDC will be an **Open Meeting at 7pm at the Auburn Institute**. There will be two main topics for discussion and sharing of information/ideas:

- the establishment of an Auburn Men's Shed, and
- Auburn Streetscape Plan. Council has allocated \$40,000 to its 2026-27 Budget for the Auburn Streetscape.

This will be an opportunity for community collaboration, revisiting the original Consultants' Plan (March 2021) and propose ideas from our community, to guide Council's spending of the allocated \$40,000.

Community members are invited to attend. Community groups will be invited to attend, with a short session available for brief reports of 'what's happening' in your group.

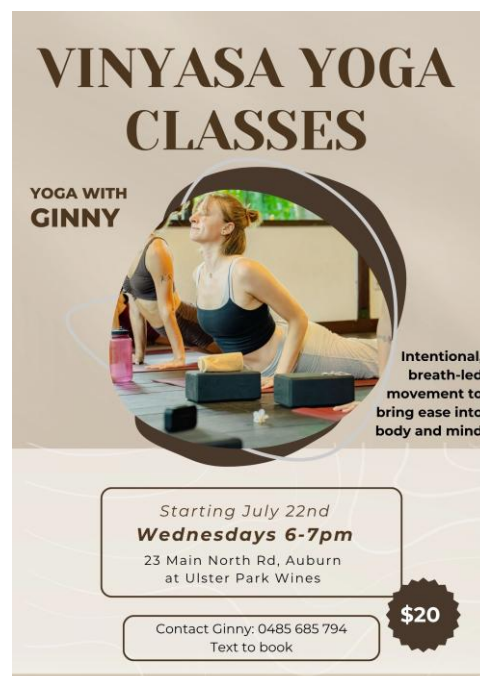

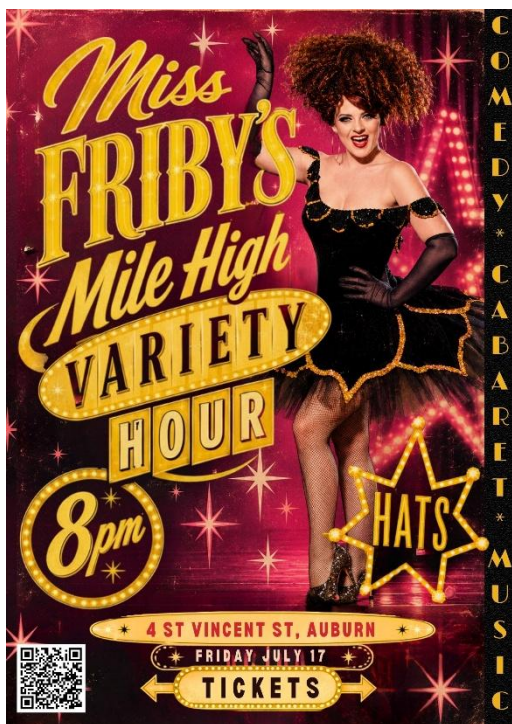

Auburn's History Column:

In 1850 a brutal murder occurred in the vicinity of Skillogalee Creek, the area where the Auburn- Balaklava Road crosses the creek to go onto the plains. At a high point off this road was situated John HOILE'S Public House.

A Court Case was held at HOILE'S Pubic House and at the LAW AND POLICE COURTS, POLICE COURT ADELAIDE and reported on in the South Australian Register – Monday August 5th 1850 when JAMES YATES was charged with the wilful murder of JOHN MANSFORTH (more commonly called the Sergeant) at Skillogalee Creek on the 24th ultimo (*last month*).

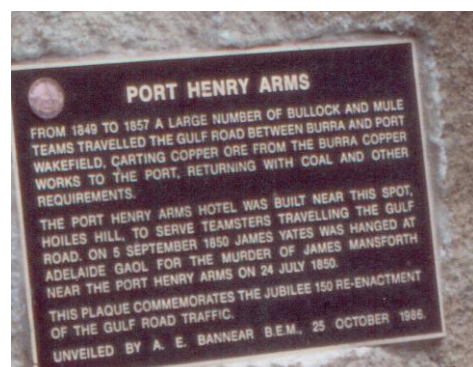
Clare surgeon Charles Houtten WEBB gave a graphic description of the grisly murder most likely carried out with a stone and a blunt instrument that were nearby.

When JAMES YATES was asked if he wanted a lawyer to defend him, he replied “No Sir, I know nothing about any murder, I’m perfectly innocent of it.”

His Worship then asked if he wanted to ask the witness any questions?

The Prisoner stated “No. What he had stated is a perfect mystery to me.”

The Doctor was questioned further and stated that a 5s. Burra Burra order was inside MANSFORTH'S pocket book, both were stained with blood.

James HENDERSON, examined, stated that he was at Hoile's Public House on the afternoon of the 25th ultimo. After he had been there for some time, about 4 o'clock, the landlord came into the room where he was sitting, and told him that a man had been murdered close by. Went in company of Mr. WARRIMER to where the body was lying, but could not see the face, as the head appeared severed from the body, and to be lying on the ground. There were a great many footprints about as if a struggle had taken place and the knife produced was lying in a pool of blood.

The body was then put in a cart and taken to Hoile's Public House, which is about half a mile off. There was a kangaroo bitch (*dog*) with two pups, lying close to the body and she growled at their approach. Witness having heard that she belonged to the deceased, thought she had remained there from fidelity to her master, but, on his return with the cart, he found the lower jaw had disappeared during the interval of absence, though not above a quarter of an hour, and he therefore came to the conclusion that she had been feeding upon the mangled remains of her master. (A thrill of horror here ran through the Court).

John HAWKSWORTH, Barman at John Hoile's public house, near Skillogalee Creek, stated that on the 24th Ultimo, the deceased, came to their house alone, about four o'clock in the afternoon, and asked witnesses for some dinner and a pint of ale, which he gave him. Previously the prisoner was there, he was waiting for the Sergeant at the butcher's, named TICKMAN, next door. The deceased said he had been asleep on the run and ordered another pint of ale for himself and a glass of rum for the prisoner. Sergeant told YATES that he was wanted by Slater at the head station.

The deceased asked barman to fill a bottle of whisky and paid for it with notes, Burra orders and silver. The prisoner YATES held the arm of the deceased but the men did not agree. The deceased then got the bottle from the witness and went away. Mrs Hoile ordered the prisoner to leave the parlour, as he had insulted a young woman who was there. The prisoner left the house, running after the

deceased. About twenty minutes after the prisoner had left the house, the deceased returned very much excited and said "That blackguard has insulted me and taken the whiskey from me". Heard nothing more of him till the next afternoon, when his body was found.

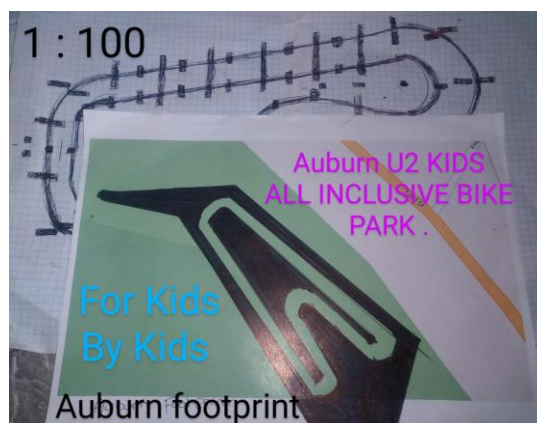

Auburn Green – Caring for Country

Winter: Attracting Butterflies to Your Garden

Even in the cooler months, your garden can be a haven for butterflies. While many species slowdown in winter, become dormant, you'd be surprised how a few small changes can invite life into your patch of paradise.

Common Butterflies in Our Region

In the Clare Valley, local butterflies such as the *Red-spotted Jezebel*, *Common Brown*, *Wanderer (Monarch)*, and *Australian Painted Lady* may still be spotted on sunny winter days. And of course, keep an eye out for the beautifully elusive *Emerald Jewel (Red Emerald)*, a rare treat when seen fluttering through native shrubs.

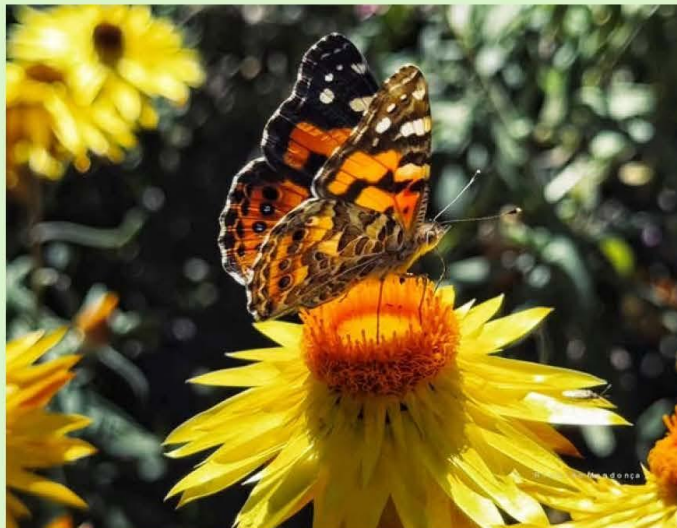

Winter Gardening Tips

Butterflies are drawn to sunny, sheltered spots with food plants for their caterpillars and nectar for the adults. Here's how you can help:

 **Plant Native Species:** Local natives are best suited to our climate and butterfly species. Try planting:

- *Woolly Tea-tree* (*Leptospermum lanigerum*) – great for shelter and nectar
- *Goodenia ovata* – bright flowers even in winter
- *Correa reflexa* (Native Fuchsia) – blooms that feed both butterflies and birds
- *Hardenbergia violacea* (Native Lilac) – a climber with stunning purple flowers

 **Provide Winter Blooms:** Flowering annuals like calendula or pansies can supplement native plants with extra colour and nectar.

 **Offer Water:** Shallow dishes with pebbles give butterflies a place to safely drink.

 **Avoid Pesticides:** Chemicals can harm butterflies and their caterpillars. Let nature manage your pests.

Let Your Garden Speak for the Climate

Even small patches of green can offer sanctuary to wildlife. By planting for pollinators, you're helping restore natural cycles and support biodiversity right here in Auburn.

Together, we're caring for country – one garden at a time.

The Voice of the Valley: A History of the Auburn CFS Siren

If you've lived in Auburn for a while, the rising and falling wail of the fire siren is a familiar sound. But have you ever wondered why we still use it, or where it came from?

The Auburn CFS Brigade was established in 1939, and for decades, it operated out of the "original" station on our current site at 6 Port Road. In those early years, before the days of digital pagers and smartphone apps, the siren was the *only* way to call our volunteers from their farms, shops, and homes. When that siren sounded, it meant the community was in trouble, and the crew was on its way.

While our current modern station was built in the early 2000s to accommodate our growing fleet and equipment, a conscious decision was made to keep the siren operational. Not all brigades have one today, but Auburn's siren remains a vital secondary backup. In an age of high-tech alerts, it serves as a fail-safe; if the mobile networks or pagers ever go down, the siren will always work.





What do the sounds mean? To help our neighbours understand what they are hearing, we follow a strict set of protocols:

- **The Emergency Turnout:** Three distinct rising and falling blasts indicate an active incident. This alerts the public to watch for volunteers moving toward the station and for fire trucks exiting onto Port Road.
- **Testing & Training:** We conduct regular "growl tests" to ensure the motor is functional. These usually take place on our **Tuesday night training sessions at 7:00 PM**.
- You might also hear it during our monthly business meetings, held on the **second Tuesday of each month**. The siren is more than just an alarm; it's a link to our brigade's history and a constant guardian for the town. Next time you hear those three blasts, know that your local volunteers are answering the call.

2026 Clare Valley flocking of the woollen sheep

The 2026 Clare Valley Festival of the Lamb in partnership with the SACWA Warnes Group and the Plains Producer is staging a Clare Valley knitted flock of woollen lambs and window display.

The Clare Valley Festival of the Lamb is a multi-day festival which began in 2020 with a focus on attracting people to the Valley to celebrate the sheep industry. It is the regions spring equinox festival which combines with the first buds of the vines and the premier time for new-season lambs.

The SACWA Warnes Group are collaborating with the festival and the Plains Producer for the Flocking of the Sheep Exhibition. This is designed for people to create a sheep using wool and then send it to the festival so they can then be displayed throughout the Clare Valley at selected venues. At the end of the festival the sheep will then be rounded up and made available for the SACWA Baby Parcels and Emergency Aid.

People are invited to visit the Clare Valley Festival of the Lamb website <https://cvfol.au/> to view some patterns. The sheep can be knitted / crocheted but they must use sheep's wool and people then send them to the festival and they are asked to include a name for their sheep.

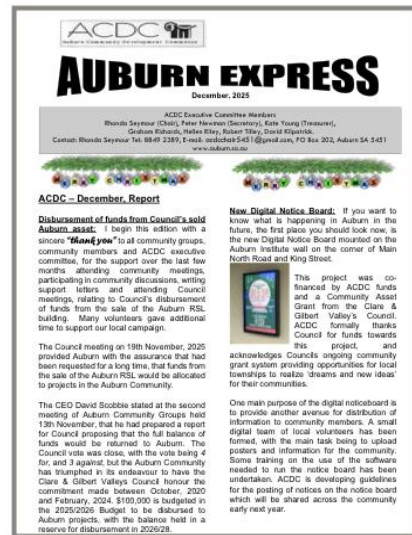
